

Trophies

Compared to many other clubs, Stockport does not have many trophies but a number have an interesting history. It appears that in the club's early years, trophies which were won more than once by the same person became the private property of the winners.

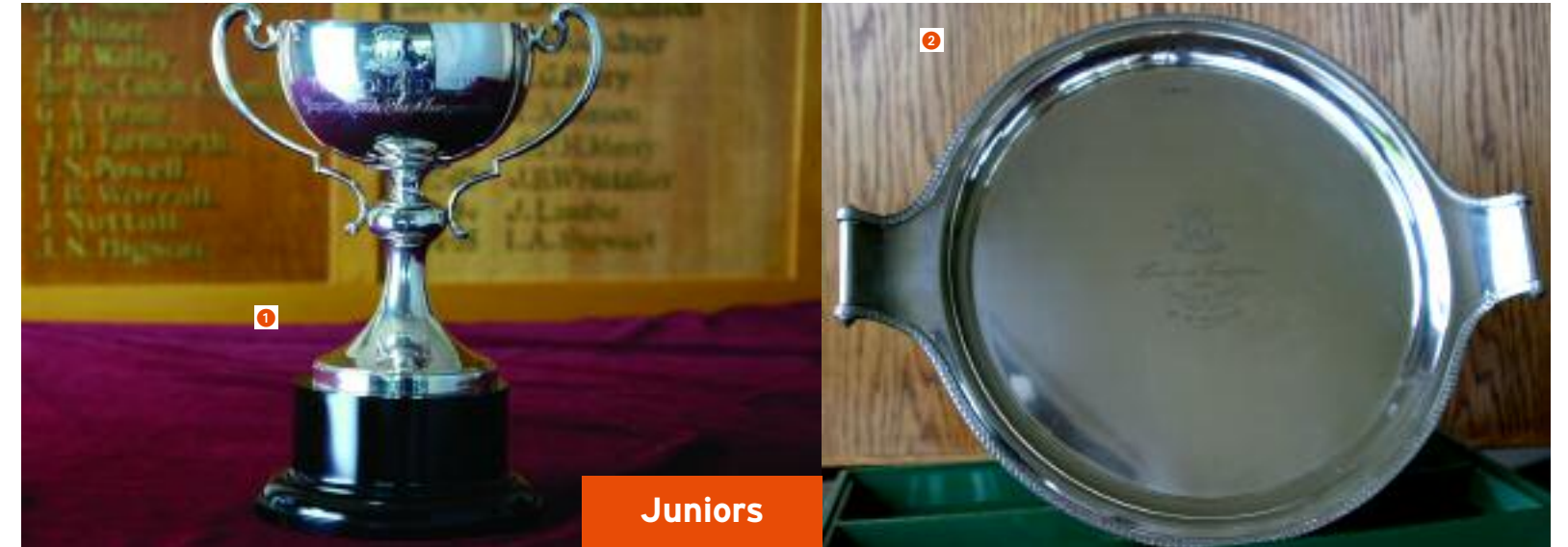
Mens

- McIntyre Trophy** – won by Donald McIntyre in 1919 and presented to the club by Mrs McIntyre in 1930. The 4 players in each division returning the lowest cards in each of the 6 monthly medal competitions qualify to play in the final for the McIntyre Trophy.
- Nuttall Trophy** – presented to the club by Mrs Phyllis Nuttall in 1968 in memory of her husband John, who had been President in 1959/60. The Trophy is awarded to the members returning the lowest aggregate of 4 medal rounds during the season.
- The Mackenzie Trophy** – originally presented by Mr Sidney Potter as his Captain's prize in 1921 and won by George Mackenzie. George presented the Trophy back to the club in 1955.
The Trophy is awarded to the winners of the annual singles knock-out competition.
- The Victory Trophy** – originally known as the Arundal Trophy, presented to the club by H.Arundal who was Captain throughout the 1914-1918 war years. In 1919 the cup was renamed the Victory Trophy.
The Trophy is played for as a major competition in July each year.
- The Trickey Trophies** – these salvers were presented by R.S. Owen Captain in 1938 to Arnold and Eric Trickey, who were twins, as his Captain's prize. Donated to the club, the Trophies are contested in a fourball competition during the season.
- L. T. Ranells Cup** – this cup was presented to the club in 1990. It had been won in 1952 by Laurie Ranells as second amateur in the Silver King Tournament a national competition. Laurie was a leading amateur golfer and a member at Stockport.

- Mrs White's Cup** – presented in 1923 by Mrs Percy White who was Lady Captain at the same time as her husband was Captain. *The Cup is played for annually over 36 holes.*
- The Spring Cup** – the ladies oldest trophy, originally known as The Challenge Cup, was presented to the ladies in 1912 by Mr Charles Winterbottom. Mr Winterbottom, a bachelor who lived in Torkington, was related to the Shepley family (who sold the land on which the course was constructed) and a close friend of Dr. and Mrs Murray, first Lady Captain at Torkington whose son later became a life member. The cup is contested annually
- The Jean Turner Friendship Trophy** – was presented in 1997 by past Lady Captain Jean Turner to foster and maintain the friendships forged through golf. The trophy is competed for annually with ladies drawing for partners.
- Singles Knock Out Trophy** – this silver bon-bon dish was presented back to the ladies section in 1962 by the daughter of Mrs Theresa Johnson who had won it as a Lady Captain's Prize in the 1930's. The Trophy is awarded to the winner – of the annual singles knock-out competition.
- Torkington Bowl** – presented to the Ladies Section in 1938 by Mrs. E. Earnshaw in 1958 when it was known as the Earnshaw Cup. Mrs Earnshaw had been Lady Captain from 1938 until 1945 and held many positions in Northern Counties golf – she was aged 78 when she retired as Honourary secretary of the Northern Counties L.G.A. The Trophy is contested annually by the winners of each L.G.U medal competition.
- Barbara Swales Veterans Trophy** – Barbara Swales was Lady Captain in 1968/69 and presented this Trophy which was first contested in 1992. It is awarded annually for the best score by a lady aged 60 years and over.
- Gold Medal** – this was purchased in 1912 by the Ladies Section and competed for annually in a scratch competition. Mrs Murray was the first winner, Elisabeth Wilson has won the Gold Medal on no fewer than 21 occasions starting in 1976, Mrs Nancy Haliwell won 12 times between 1947 and 1961 whilst Ruth Hughes has won it 11 times.



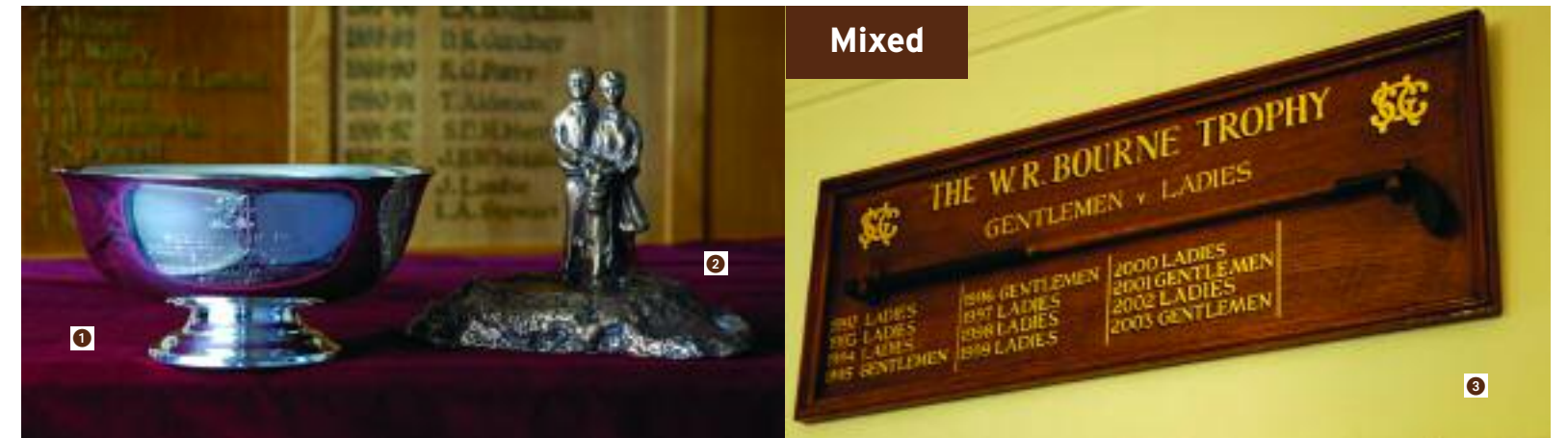

Juniors

- The Ronald Cup** – donated by Mr Archie Ronald in 1991 to the Juniors and competed for annually in a match play event. Archie was Junior organiser for many years and did much to encourage junior golf at the club.
- Sidebottom Trophy** – This salver originates from 1924 when it was won by Israel Sidebottom as the prize for the Singles Knock-out competition and it was donated by the then Captain Mr Percy White. The Salver was presented back to the Club and initially it was competed for annually by the 'young' members – the age limit being increased each year to ensure the competition continued. Eventually, with a thriving Junior section, the Trophy is now presented to the winner of an annual medal competition.

- Millennium Trophy** – presented in 2000 by the then captain, Mr Colin Maguire and the Lady Captain, Mrs Voirrey Oxley. Contested annually.
- Tom Cock Trophy** – presented in 1977 by the then Captain, Mr Harry Hitchcock and the Lady Captain, Mrs Margery Tommis. The Trophy is presented to the winners of the annual mixed knock-out competition.
- The WR Bourne Trophy** is contested from time to time in a Gentlemen v Ladies match. It is based on a hickory shafted putter made by Walter Bourne while he was Professional at Stockport from 1913 to 1923.
